It's safe to say the Pro's 1.2MP front- and rear-facing cameras won't replace your DSLR anytime soon.

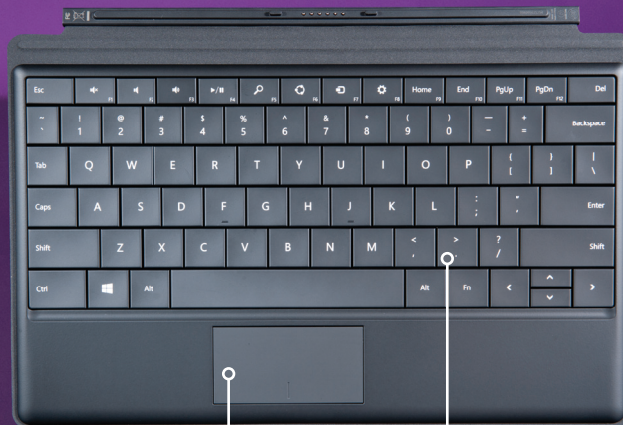


### DREAM SCREEN

It's tough to find a capable Windows 8 tablet for less than 10 Benjamins. Enter Microsoft's Surface Pro. Sure, \$900 is still pretty pricey, but it won't seem as bad once you see the kind of power this device packs.

While the Intel Core i5-3317U processor and integrated HD Graphics 4000 card aren't the baddest hardware available, they're certainly no slouches. The Surface won't rock *Crysis 3* on its

highest settings, but it's burly enough to run last year's games reasonably well. Just watch your battery level—when I wanted to get in a few games of *League* after work, the battery gave out after only two or so hours.

Wondering if there'll be enough software to support your system? Unlike the cost-sensitive Surface RT, the Pro enjoys a genuine Windows 8 architecture—meaning any app (read:

game) you can install on a desktop will work here, too...just as long as it doesn't require an optical disc drive.

The Surface works well as a work-horse machine and, compared to other full-fledged Windows 8 tablets, its lower price helps it stand head and shoulders above the competition. If you're looking for a versatile Windows machine that goes where you do, Microsoft has you covered.
